It is incredibly important to meet the entry deadline as first semester observations are weighted one-third and second semester observations are weighted two-thirds. Mid-Year Distribution Reports

Over the next few weeks, we will be sending mid-year distribution reports to CORE Directors and directors of schools. These reports will include:

- 2013-14 Distribution of Observation Scores

- Percentage of Educators with Growth and Achievement Measure Selections

These reports provide a snapshot of the progress made in your schools to date and help identify schools that may need extra support. Observations that are not entered by *Friday, Jan.* 16 will not be included in these reports. Please remember that it is important

to both complete observations and enter the data into CODE in a timely manner. This ensures that teachers receive valuable feedback and have full access to their data.
