Gov. Haslam Unveils Investment in Education for FY16 Budget

Last week, Gov. Haslam presented his State of the State address to the General Assembly and released his FY16 budget, once again prioritizing education with an

investment of nearly \$170 million for K-12 education. Highlights include:

- Nearly \$100 million for increasing teacher compensation, which amounts to a 4 percent pool that local districts will have available as they make local decisions;
- An additional \$6 million in teacher salary equity funds
- Nearly \$44 million for growth and inflationary adjustments within the Basic Education Program; and
- \$5 million to create the Educators' Liability Trust Fund to offer liability insurance to Tennessee teachers at no cost to them.


Tennessee Students Share Why They Write
