## Local Evaluation Decisions 2014-15

As we wrap up the 2013-14 school year, it is important to begin making decisions about the 2014-15 school year. By *Friday, June 20*, please fill out <u>this survey</u>, which includes all of the decision points below. It may be helpful for you to print this document so that you can walk through each of the decision points with your team prior to completing the survey. Expressing interest in any of these options does not bind you to implementation, but will allow us to better differentiate planning and support ahead of the 2014-15 school year. Once you express interest, we will follow up with additional information and next steps.

# I. Local Decisions

The following areas of flexibility already exist within current policy. The decision to engage in these types of flexibility may be made locally. Districts do not need TDOE approval to engage in these activities, however, we are always happy to discuss potential implications and best practices.

- Requiring co-observations for all, or a subset, of teachers
- Requiring specific evaluator norming activities at certain points in the school year
- Requiring that all, or a subset, of teachers have multiple observers over the course of the year
- Exceeding the minimum number of required observations for certain groups of educators
- Requiring more than the minimum unannounced observations
- Requiring observations to be sequenced or combined in a specific way

# II. Non-Tested Grades and Subjects

#### **III. Innovative Practices**

Due to resource limitations, in some instances, these opportunities will only be available to a limited number of districts.

• Use Tripod Student Perception Survey for 5 percent of evaluations

- Pilot a new student perception survey instrument for feedback purposes only
- Use Tripod survey for feedback purposes only (district cost associated with this choice)
- Participate in the Evaluation Partnership Program
