Activities and Materials

The key to this indicator is the teacher's ability to use a variety of materials and activities in lessons to meet the various needs of all students.

The descriptors in this indicator pertain to supporting the content of the lesson, the students during the lesson, and the materials used during the lesson.

The descriptors for activities and materials can be categorized into three types:

- Content
- Student
- Materials

Evaluator Expectations

In the pre-conference, ask, "How are the activities and materials you selected for this lesson aligned to the daily objective, and what type of thinking and problem solving is needed to complete the activities? How will you allow for meaningful student-to-student interaction?"

To score this indicator, the observer will need to look for:

- activities that provide opportunities for thinking and problem solving,
- alignment to the daily objective,
- student engagement,
- appropriately rigorous activities, and
- a variety of materials.

This indicator aligns with *Teacher Knowledge of Students, Thinking,* and *Problem Solving*.

Content Descriptors

Content Descriptors	Implementation	Indicator Alignment
Support lesson objective	Activities move students toward mastery of the daily objective.	Standards and objectives and Teacher Content Knowledge
Are challenging	Activities should push all students toward productive struggle.	Teacher Knowledge of Students, Thinking, and Problem Solving
Elicit a variety of thinking	Activities should prompt analytical, practical, creative, and research-based thinking.	Thinking
Are relevant to students' lives	Activities should incorporate student's different learning styles, student's interests and cultural heritage, and how the content can be used in the real world.	Motivating Students
Demand complex thinking and analysis	Activities should provide students with the opportunity to analyze, evaluate, and explain their thinking.	Problem Solving and Questioning
Texts and tasks are appropriately complex	Materials should be aligned to the grade level standard and scaffolded to meet the various needs of students.	Teacher Content Knowledge and Teacher Knowledge of Students



Student Descriptors	Implementation	Indicator Alignment
Sustain students' attention	Activities keep students engaged in the lesson.	Motivating Students and Teacher Knowledge of Students
Provide opportunities for student-to- student interaction	Activities provide students with opportunities to learn from peers and give each other feedback.	Grouping and Academic Feedback
Induce student curiosity and suspense	Activities motivate students to ask questions and seek further understanding, leading to research-based thinking.	Motivating Students and Questioning
Provide students with choices	Activities provide students with ownership over their learning style and their application of content.	Motivating Students and Teacher Knowledge of Students



- Students were given the opportunity to independently choose what to write on their boards.
- The turn and talk activity allowed students the opportunity to interact with one another and share what they would buy with their money.
- This conversation provided students with time to reflect and was relevant to their lives.

- The students are given a choice in what they want to build. This autonomy encourages student participation and engagement.
- They related their project to another assignment in a different class.
- Students work together to design their project. They can discuss their thinking and problem solving as they create their project.

Student Descriptors	Implementation	Indicator Alignment
Incorporate multimedia and technology	The Multimedia materials used should enhance student learning of the content.	Motivating Students and Teacher Content Knowledge
Incorporate resources beyond the school curriculum texts	Activities could be game-like, involve simulations, require creating products, and demand self-direction and self-monitoring. This may also include using photographs, personal artifacts, manipulatives, and cross- curricular materials.	Motivating Students and Teacher Content Knowledge
